Deep River Police Service Report –April 2010

The Deep River Police Service supports the Renfrew County Victims Crisis Assistance & Referral Service (**RC VCARS**) efforts with victims of crime and tragic circumstances. Watering restriction have been in effect since May 1, 2010 and will be until September 30, 2010. We will be giving special attention to this issue with strict enforcement being utilized to ensure compliance with bylaw # 14-2001.

General – The Service responded to a total of 150 police related issues during the month. There were two Liquor License Act issues dealt with in May. The Service conducted ten volunteer screening checks.

Traffic – Officers issued 114 provincial offences notices during the month. There were ten motor vehicle collisions investigated in May. Six traffic complaints were reported during the month, three of which were related to incidents on Hwy 17.

Crime – There was a total of six criminal occurrences investigated in the month. Two of the incidents were assaults. Thefts accounted for two of the other criminal occurrences. The remainder was as follows; sexual assault x 1, threats x 1.

Monthly Crimes

- May 02 - Constable Steve Lehoux received a complaint of an assault. The adult female provided information of a domestic assault which occurred in April. Investigation by the officer lead to an adult male being charged and having to appear in Pembroke criminal court.
- May 06 - Sergeant Barry Swarbrick received information from a local institution reporting an assault occurrence. Investigation revealed that an adult female had assaulted another adult female. Circumstances particular to the situation lead to the matter being cleared otherwise.

- May 08 - Constable Darin Faris received a complaint at the office regarding threats. Investigation revealed the complainant had been at a downtown premises talking with another adult male whom he knew. The suspect became agitated by the discussion and made some verbal threats. A relative of the complainant was approached and had a verbal confrontation with the suspect. Afterwards the complainant attended the office and decided not to pursue criminal action. Police later spoke with the suspect. The matter was cleared otherwise.
- May 12 - Constable Rob Medeiros received a theft complaint from a service center on Hwy 17. The complainant advised of a gas and dash. There was no description of the person(s) involved, but the vehicle was described as a mini van dark red/brown, Pontiac Montana. Patrol of the highway was made and the information passed on to the OPP.
- May 15 - Constable Steve Lehoux received a call to attend the hospital regarding a possible sexual assault. The officer spoke with a patient who provided information that they had been sexually assaulted at a residence in the center of town. A detailed investigation was commenced and is ongoing.
- May 31 - Constable Amanda Ueltzhoffer received a theft complaint from a service center on Hwy. 17. The complainant advised of a gas and dash. The driver of the suspect vehicle was male and there was a male passenger. An attempt to pay with a credit card had been made before the dark blue Toyota with a boat in tow headed off eastbound. Patrol of the highway was made and the OPP notified.
